**Jottings from Hersey** - I am delighted to report here that Susan spotted a kingfisher perched on a branch over the stream, and John's CCTV has filmed hedgehogs in his back garden. We've been planting trees well protected from deer and rabbits.

Since we have so many new residents recently, I thought it worth repeating some of the history of the village. William the Conqueror gave the town of Pithard to Hugh, Earl of Chester, and The Doomsday Book recorded that the earl held land in Pilardetune (Nether Pillerton). The estate later passed to Hugh de Hersey, from whom the village got its present name. The enclosures act in 1794 marked a major change in the medieval ridge and furrow fields. At this time Briar Furlong was given to the village "for the benefit of such industrious persons belonging to the parish as should not receive relief from the poor rates".

In 1798, Charles Mills bought the manor, and much of the estate remained in the hands of the family until Miss Phoebe Mills died in 1971. The Ladywalk behind the church is named after Madam Horseman whose ghost was said to appear there. William Allibone, is remembered on a headstone in the churchyard. *Ros Williams* 

**Pillerton Hersey Parish Council** - The date of our next ordinary meeting is 15<sup>th</sup> November, to be held in Pillerton Priors village hall. Agendas (including the venue) are posted on the village notice board next to the post box and on our website.

The Council have decided to meet every other month (rather than quarterly). Dates for 2023 meetings will be available on our website in the near future.

In September two Councillors attended a meeting of the Low Carbon Warwickshire Network and learnt more about the pros and cons of heat pumps and using thermal imaging cameras to assess your home's energy efficiency. Representatives from the Heating Hub (www.theheatinghub.co.uk) gave practical advice for householders about how to reduce energy bills and optimise boiler performance.

As we enter the darker months, please remember to take a torch with you if out walking your dog first thing in the morning or later in the evening to make it easier to see and clear up any mess. The countryside code has lots of advice, including the importance of keeping dogs under effective control and respecting other people, so we can all enjoy our time outside.
