'New Beginnings'

We all have different response to seasons of 'New Beginnings'. Some of us embrace change with open arms and energy others have to be almost prised away from the familiar to start something new, whether it's a new job, a change of furniture or a house move.

The month of May this year marks a number of 'New Beginnings'. For our nation it is the month when our new King will be crowned. For King Charles and for us May 6 marks a new season. The Coronation in Westminster Abbey will be a service that will be steeped in centuries of tradition and Christian symbols. At this time of change we are encouraged to pray for King Charles, the Royal Family and our nation, to hold him and all of us before God.

One of the prayers suggested is:

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and good of your church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

At the end of May we will also celebrate Pentecost (Whit Sunday), this great church festival marks what was a new beginning for Jesus' followers after his resurrection and ascension into heaven. God sent His Holy Spirit on them with such power that they were changed, any hesitancy they had about preaching about Jesus and all that had happened was gone. From that moment the Church was born, and new groups of Christians were established over a widespread area. Change was afoot, God was at work, the good news of Jesus was being spread and that in itself would be a challenge to many.

The coming months also marks a change and new beginning for me and my husband Peter. He has his 66th birthday and we will retire. As I write this, we are still completing on a property north of Inverness - for those of you who have made that journey into retirement yourselves you will know the change and new beginnings it brought into your lives! For me,

along with the excitement, there is a sadness that I will be stepping aside from the support I have been giving the Stourdene Benefice (Scotland is too far away to commute!!). This role was always a temporary one, but it has been for me a time of great joy - so thank you to you all for the welcome, the encouragement and enthusiasm you have shared with me. At our wedding, Peter and I had a passage from the Old Testament prophet Jeremiah read which included these words: 'For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for your harm, to give you a future with hope' Jeremiah 29 v 11

In this season of change and new beginnings I believe that the promise of God's remains true for us all. Whether we embrace change or struggle with it, the truth is that God cares for us; he loves us and wants the best for us, and so we can trust him with the next stage of the journey because it is in his hands, whether we are in Scotland or Stourdene!!

Jottings from Hersey - I'm excited about planting a tree for the Coronation. The Queen's Green Canopy initiative said: "By inviting everyone to plant considerable numbers of new trees throughout the country, QGC seeks to highlight the significant value of trees and woodlands as nature's simple but highly effective way to clean the air we breathe, slow the impact of climate change, create important wildlife habitats and improve our general health and wellbeing."

Ten years ago, I planted an oak tree that I had grown from an acorn to celebrate the birth of our first grandchild. Trees do grow slowly but, protected from rabbits and deer, it is now about 5 metres high, and I have continued to plant more saplings as our family grows.

The Romans introduced elms to Britain and, before the 1970s, these tall trees - the Warwickshire Weed - lined the lanes of the county. The suckers from remaining trunks thrive in the hedgerows around our garden until succumbing once again to Dutch elm disease. What is reassuring is that some 40 years later, other trees such as ash have taken the elms' place.

In Hersey, many of us have fields and large gardens - plenty of space to plant a tree for the Coronation. *Ros Williams*

a stroke? Act "FAST" ...

Face – the person's face may have dropped on one side, and may not be able to smile, or their mouth or eye may have drooped.

Arms – the person may not be able to lift both arms and keep them there because of weakness or numbness in one arm.

Speech – their speech may be slurred or garbled, or they may not be able to talk despite appearing to be awake; they may also have problems to understand what you're saying to them.

Time – it's time to dial 999 immediately if you notice any of these signs or symptoms. *Emily Taylor*
