We will trial these times for two months to see how they are received. Common Worship Communion on the first Sunday will remain at 11.00 am. NB 24th September will be 6.00pm for the harvest festival and 22nd October 11.00 for a Christening.

Jottings from Hersey- What a year it has been: extremes of heat, cold and rain. In my garden some plants have died, and some plants have thrived, swamping more delicate specimens. Under shrubs and in bare soil, sycamore, dog rose, bramble and thistle seedlings proliferate, and it's essential to root these out while still small enough. That's keeping me busy. But worse, for our farmers, has been the delay in the harvest. Wheat grown for bread flour deteriorates and can only be sold for animal feed. However, colossal combine harvesters eventually worked late into the night with powerful headlights and great clouds of dust. Along with unpredictable grain shipments from Ukraine, and the rising price of fuel and fertiliser, the cost of our food will undoubtedly continue to rise. Hay making - traditionally done in July on warm and breezy days - was delayed by nearly a month. Cut late and there is a big drop in the quality, and wet grass can start to ferment in the field. I was surprised to read that damp hay can spontaneously combust. Ref. my recent jotting: A retired Pillerton farmer confided in me that it was he who erected the "No Parking" sign which so annoyed Miss Mills. Ros Williams

Pillerton Hersey Parish Council - Healthcare: Over recent months, the parish council has continued to engage with county and district councillors and action groups regarding local healthcare provision. This includes ongoing concerns about the Ellen Badger Hospital and the need for medical provision at Upper Lighthorne. Although the latter may not be used directly by residents in the parish, there could be an impact on other facilities in the area.

Local environment: As we enter the Autumn and the day lengths are sadly getting shorter, the parish council often receives more reports regarding dog mess, including full bags that have been left.

Dog fouling is illegal in the UK. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled, or not having a suitable bag, is not a reasonable excuse. We know that most dog owners are caring and responsible people, but we ask everyone to ensure that dog mess is not only cleaned up but then taken home and put in a bin.

Adults eligible for vaccines are individuals older than 65 (including people who will turn 65, up to and including, 31st March 2024), and individuals aged 18 to 64 and who are medically eligible (these include frontline workers in a healthcare or social care setting; individuals with coeliac disease, chronic respiratory disease, chronic heart disease, chronic kidney disease, chronic liver disease, diabetes, chronic neurological disease; individuals taking immunosuppressants and their household contacts; individuals without a spleen, or who are pregnant, or with a BMI exceeding 40; carers in receipt of a carers' allowance, or an individual who is the main carer of an elderly or disabled person - please ensure you have registered as a carer on our website or with the reception team).

Children: At the time of writing this, we do not have a confirmed date for the arrival of the children's vaccine. Please keep an eye on our website and the Facebook page for further information. We will be able to vaccinate all children who – as of 31st August 2023 – are aged 2 or 3 years, in addition to those aged 6 months to 17 years who are medically eligible. Other school-age children will be vaccinated as part of the school immunisation programme, if eligible.
