Jottings from Hersey The last of the Christmas festivities, Twelfth Night, approaches: time to take down the decorations and recycle the Christmas tree. This was when traditional Mummers Plays were enjoyed in the Pillertons. The plays – may be an early form of

pantomime - were based loosely on the legend of St George and the dragon. They were performed by a cast of strange, masked and fantastically costumed characters. They were intended to show the struggle between good and evil.

One of the old men, much loved in Pillerton, was John Webb, who died in 1925 having faithfully served the Mills family most of his life. He was a great singer with a wonderful falsetto voice. He always said he did not want a piano to drown his noise. Cecil Sharp, the noted collector of English folk songs, got the Warwickshire song "The mare and the foal" from him in 1911. Mr Webb was the last of the Mummers, and said his part was to enter first with a broom saying:

"A room, a room, a rousty touse, I've brought my broom to sweep my house, For me, and all my merry company."

He did not know what a "rousty touse" meant.

The Parish Council have invested in a grit bin for the Oxhill Bridle road. Please contact the clerk by email (clerk.pillertonherseypc@outlook.com) if you notice an issue with the bin or more salt is required. This is for residents to use on the road when there are icy conditions.

Recently there have been reported incidents of dog attacks on wildlife and livestock. Incidents should be reported to the Police or Rural Crime team by calling 101. The Countryside Code outlines that dogs must be controlled to avoid disturbing farm animals and

wildlife. Farmers are, by law, entitled to destroy a dog that injures or worries their animals.

The Parish Council has received reports of overgrown hedges adjacent to roads and along footpaths causing safety concerns, so we urge you all to see if your hedge or overhanging vegetation next to your property needs cutting back now before the nesting season starts. This is a problem that obscures road users' views of potential dangers, causes an obstruction, and affects all road users – drivers, cyclists, horse riders and walkers. The owner or occupier of a property has a legal responsibility (Highways Act 1980) to ensure that the 'public highway' (defined by law as consisting of any verge, footway, carriageway, bridleway or footpath) is not obstructed by vegetation from their property. Cutting back should be done to a minimum width from the highway of 1.2m (or to your boundary which is the central growth line of a hedge or your boundary fence) and to a height of 5.2m (roads) or 2.5m (verge/path).
